

Advocate Health Care Parish Nurse Ministry

Rev. Granger Westberg, a clergymen with years of experience serving in medical schools and hospitals, first introduced the idea of parish nursing. In 1984, Lutheran General Hospital adopted his vision and initiated the parish nurse program with area churches. The idea seemed the natural extension of the hospital's philosophy of Human Ecology, which is the understanding and care of human beings in light of their relationship to God, themselves, their families and the society in which they live.

Evangelical Health Systems developed its parish nurse program in 1989 following a similar vision. In 1995, Lutheran General Health System and Evangelical Health Systems merged to form Advocate Health Care (AHC).

The Parish Nurse Ministry embodies Advocate's vision to provide quality care to the communities it serves.

Advocate Parish Nurse Ministry currently sponsors 21 nurses in 23 congregations and through its Parish Nurse Network, which began in 2002, offers supportive services and parish nurse expertise to congregationally-based parish nurses within the Advocate service areas.

Advocate Health Care is a health system grounded in the faith traditions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) and the United Church of Christ (UCC). Our mission is to serve the health needs of individuals, families and communities through a wholistic philosophy rooted in our fundamental understanding of human beings as created in the image of God.

We understand faith communities to be vital partners with us in this mission and value the unique contribution congregations make in transforming people's lives for health and wholeness.



Integrator of Faith and Health

In all activities and interactions, the parish nurse seeks to promote the understanding of the relationship between faith and health.

Health Educator

Promotes an atmosphere where individuals of all ages, through a variety of educational activities, explores the relationship between values, attitudes, lifestyle, faith and health.

Personal Health Counselor

Discusses health issues and concerns with individuals; makes home, hospital, and nursing home visits as needed.

Referral Agent and Liaison with Congregational and Community Resources

Referrals are provided to other congregational resources, health care professionals, as well as those found in the community at large.

Coordinator of Volunteers

The purpose of the parish nurse ministry is to nurture the human spirit through health education, spiritual support and linking the needs of the whole person to resources within the congregation, community, and the health care system.

Health Advocate

The parish nurse works with the client, faith community, and primary health resources to provide whatever is in the best interest of the client from a whole person perspective, listening and supporting the client's voice when they seem to have none.
