

We're here for you

If you've been a victim of abuse, you need to know it's not your fault—and you're not alone.

At Aurora, we'll be here to help you on your path toward healing. We offer a variety of services, from counseling to medical care to community referrals and more. Our job is to make sure you understand your options so you can make the choices that are right for you. We'll support you in getting the care and services you need while respecting your wishes, because we recognize the journey to healing is different for everyone. And whatever path you take, we'll be with you every step of the way.



What happens?

One of the first steps will be receiving medical care and treatment for any injuries. Our highly trained forensic nurse examiners are available any time of the day or night, so you know you'll always be in good hands. They provide expert, compassionate care and, along with our advocates, can help you get connected with the resources you need, including:

- Getting you out of the abusive or dangerous situation
- Providing emotional support
- Conducting a physical exam and treating any injuries
- Collecting evidence as needed
- Pregnancy testing as needed
- Screening for STIs as needed
- STI and pregnancy prevention medications
- Follow-up phone and in-person contact to provide emotional support, review test results and assist with counseling referrals and community resource options

You'll also be connected with an advocate—a caregiver who will work one-on-one with you and help guide you through the process. Your advocate will be with you every step of the way and can:

- Accompany you on medical, legal and courtrelated appointments
- Contact criminal justice or social service agencies on your behalf, if requested
- Connect you with other resources and organizations as needed

24/7 Hotline

We're available 24/7 via our confidential hotline. Call **414-219-5555** to connect with a trained volunteer or staff member. We're also available via text at **414-219-1551**. Textline hours are primarily Monday-Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. with occasional extended hours, as staff are available. We're here to listen, provide support, and connect you to the resources you need.

Children's assault response

If your child was assaulted more than 72 hours ago and has no urgent medical needs, contact your local medical center in the Milwaukee area or call the 24/7 hotline at 414-219-5555. We can also help you decide what might be needed to best help your child. You can also call your local Child Advocacy Center.

Safe Mom, Safe Baby

If you're pregnant or have just had a baby and have been a victim of domestic or sexual abuse, we can help. Our goal is to help you make the best decisions regarding the safety and future of both you and your baby. In addition to all the services listed above, we can:

- Connect you to community resources like housing, shelter and legal advocacy
- Help you with W2 and WIC, child care and access to medical care
- Provide education on intimate partner violence and personal safety options
- Coordinate access to services for moms and babies
